#### **CAUTION:**

As a rule C.I. College has made it mandatory that any student who takes admission in any branch of studies of this college has to take part either in NCC or NSS while pursuing his/her course of study.

#### **COLLEGE STUDENTS' UNION:**

The college keeps maintaining an elected body of students consisting of 8 member secretaries of varied charges for every academic session. Students enrolled in this college can contest in the election subject to certain eligibility norms as prescribed in the election constitution.

#### WOMEN'S REST ROOM WITH SANITARY VENDING MACHINE:

Besides having a well-provided Women's Rest Room, the College has been provided with a Sanitary Vending machine for women staff and girl studentsof the college.

#### COMPUTER, INTERNET AND COMMUNICATION FACILITIES:

C.I. College now no longer stays aloof from the computer and internet world. Every department of both Arts and Science has now been fully equipped with computers and internet connectivity. The College is now becoming a global player of the intricacies of internet world. All the faculties including interested students without exception can certainly gain free access to the latest internet editions like INFLIBNETNLIST. The college also runs a Computer Lab where a proportionately equivalent number of computer sets to the total students' population is provided during a specified period of the college hour. Furthermore, Tele communication connectivity in the form of landline telephones is also provided to both administrative, library and teaching faculties.

#### COLLEGE HOSTELS:

The College provides separate hostel accommodation for boys and girls to the applying students on the basis of marks secured in the last examination plus distance and inconvenience taken to attend College. While enrolling students for accommodation a certain amount of weightage is already awarded to tribal students and as also to students of weaker families.

#### SCHOLARSHIPS AND STIPENDS:

C.I. College follows an elaborate mechanism of providing incentives in the form of scholarships and stipends for students belonging to Scheduled Caste (SC), Scheduled Tribe (ST), Other Backward Classes (OBC) and Persons with Disability (PWD) categories under the guideline and sponsorship of University Grants Commission (UGC), New Delhi and Minority and Other Backward Classes (MOBC) Commission.

#### SOCIAL NETWORK:

Career Counselling Cell (CCC), AIDS Awareness Cell, Red Ribbon Club (RRC), Grievance Redressal Cell, Alumni Association etc. are some of the prominent social networking cells attached to the institute through which C.I. College is tied up with the society.

#### PROVISION OF WATER FACILITIES:

In spite of the fact that the College, though not yet covered by any public hydrant pipeline technically because of its altitude, it has now started main-taining a big reservoir of its own. With this, every departmental room has been well connected and constant supply of clean water has come at the facul-ties' fingertips. In addition to this, there is also an extra provision of drinking water through mechanized water containers in all the departmental rooms and at places where students gain easy access.

#### **ADMISSION POLICY:**

- (i) Students seeking admission in B.A./B.Sc I Semester should at least se cure 50% of marks in aggregate in their last examinations for getting a seat in the college.
- (ii) Students belonging to ST/SC/OBC/Sports person/Person with Disabil-ity and securing 45% in aggregate will be granted admission.
- (iii) Based on the parameters adopted by the Admission Committee, eligible students have to face a Counselling session in presence of their parents/guardians conducted by the Admission Committee.

#### **SCHEME OF EXAMINATION:**

B.A./B.Sc. Courses: The College follows the modality of Examination Scheme laid down by the Manipur University, Canchipur.

#### ATTENDANCE:

A student needs a minimum of 75% attendance of the lectures delivered. Those students who have attended 60% and above, but less than 75% will be treated as Non-Collegiate students and can take the examinations on payment of a non-collegiate fee of Rs.300 (Rupees three hundred). Students who have failed to secure less than 60% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the examinations.

#### **COLLEGE UNIFORM:**

The College strictly follows a policy of administering students in proper uniforms.

**Boys**: Black Trousers with White Formal Shirt, Black Shoes and White Shocks.

**Girls**: Black Fanek, White Formal Shirt, Black Shoes and White Shocks.

### DOS AND DON'TS FOR STUDENTS:

#### DOS:

- (ix) Any student must seek prior approval from the concerned authority in case of eventualities involving his/her physical presence outside the college premises during college hours.
